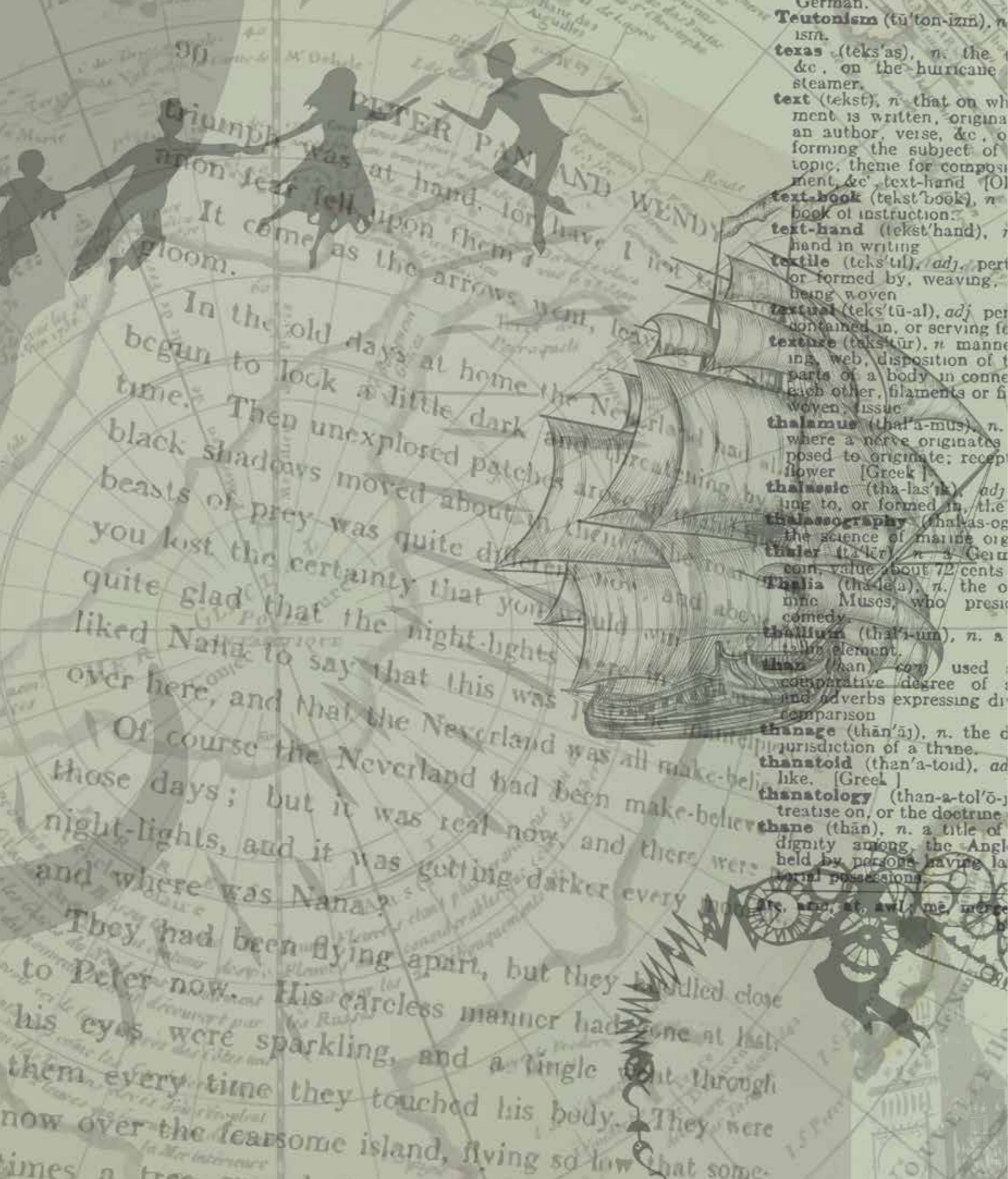
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Teutonic (tū'ton-izm), *n.* German.

texas (teks'as), *n.* the state &c. on the hurricane steamer.

text (tekst), *n.* that on which a document is written, original of an author, verse, &c. forming the subject of composition, &c. text-hand (Oxford).

text-book (tekst'book), *n.* book of instruction.

text-hand (tekst'hand), *n.* hand in writing.

textile (tekst'il), *adj.* pertaining to or formed by weaving, being woven.

textual (tekst'ū-al), *adj.* pertaining to or serving for text.

texture (tekst'ūr), *n.* manner of weaving, disposition of the parts of a body in connection with each other, filaments or fibers woven.

thalamus (thal'a-mus), *n.* where a nerve originates, exposed to originate; receptacle for a flower [Greek].

thalassic (tha-las'ik), *adj.* pertaining to, or formed in, the sea.

thalassography (thalas-og'og-ree), *n.* the science of marine origin.

thaler (thal'er), *n.* a German coin, value about 72 cents.

Thalia (thal'ia), *n.* the comic Muse, who presides over comedy.

thallium (thal'i-um), *n.* a metallic element.

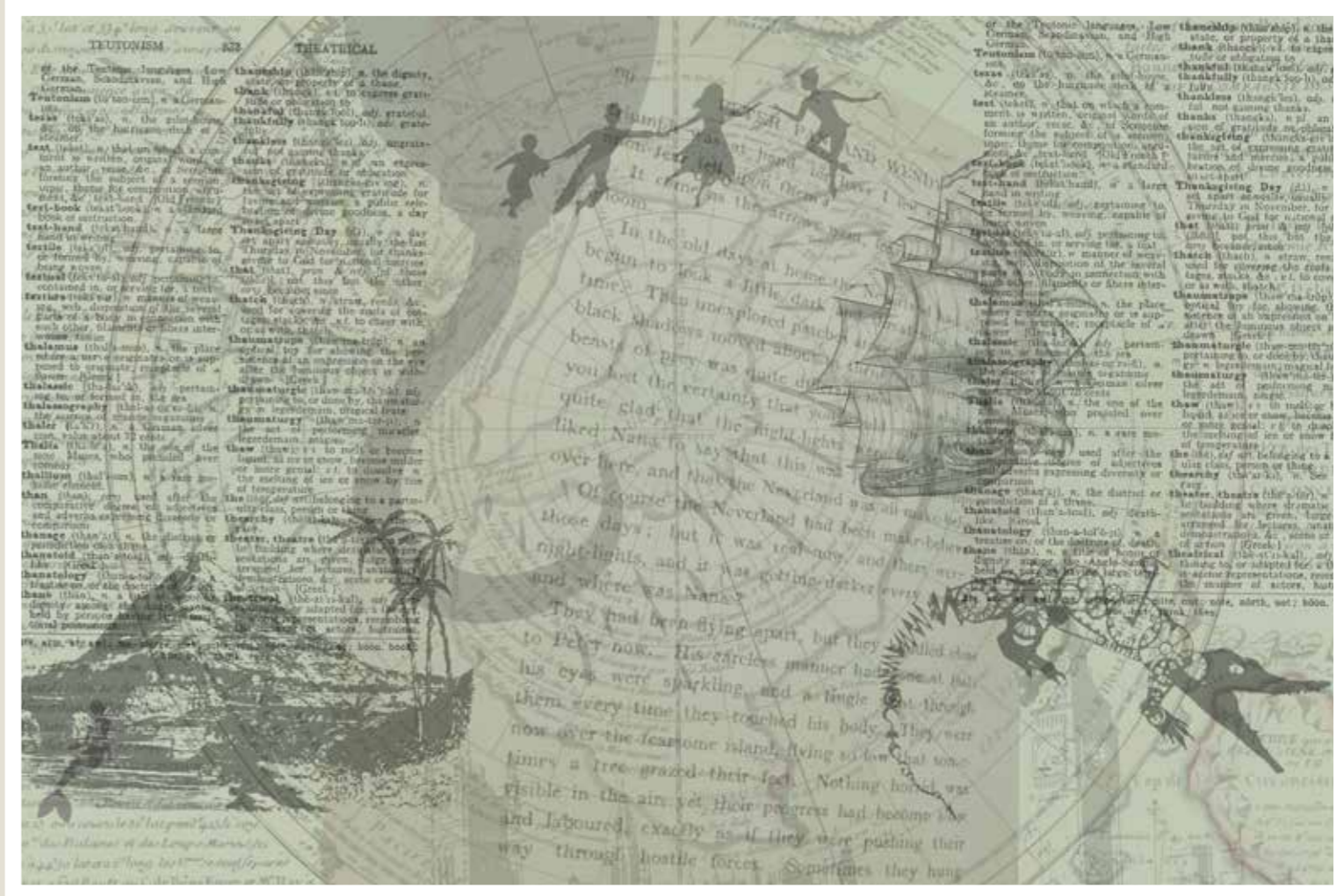
than (han), *conj.* used as a comparative degree of comparison.

thane (thā'n), *n.* the jurisdiction of a thane.

thanatoid (than'a-toid), *adj.* like death. [Greek.]

thanatology (than-a-tol'ō-j-ee), *n.* treatise on, or the doctrine of, death.

thane (thān), *n.* a title of dignity among the Angles held by persons having landed possessions.



THEATICAL

theatrical (theat'ri-kal), *adj.* pertaining to or characteristic of a theatre.

theatre (theat'er), *n.* a building where dramatic performances are given, large or small, and adapted for a particular purpose.

No ragazzi avete sbagliato. C'era una volta un un pezzo di legno, un paese incantato, un gatto furbo e cortese...

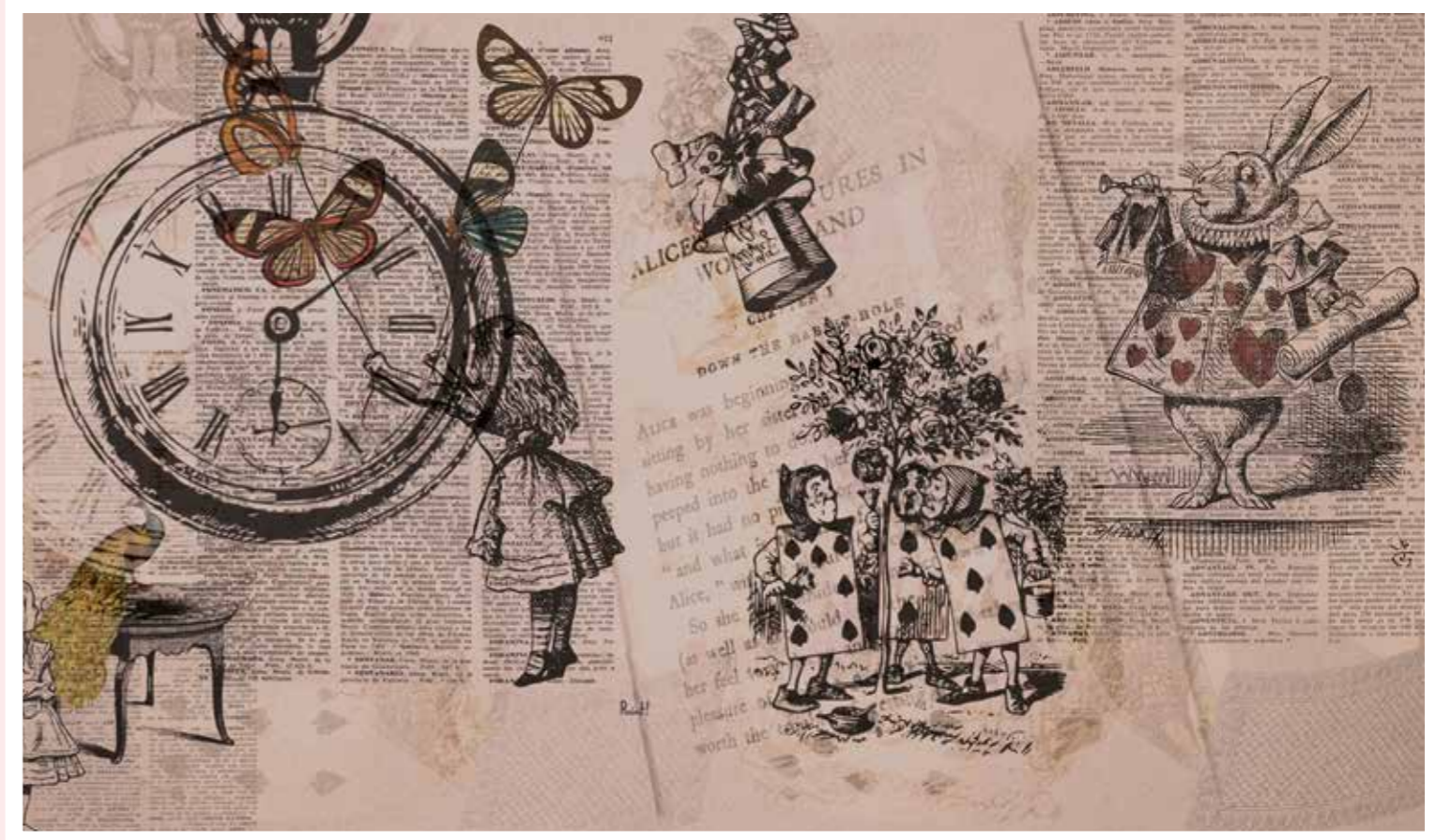

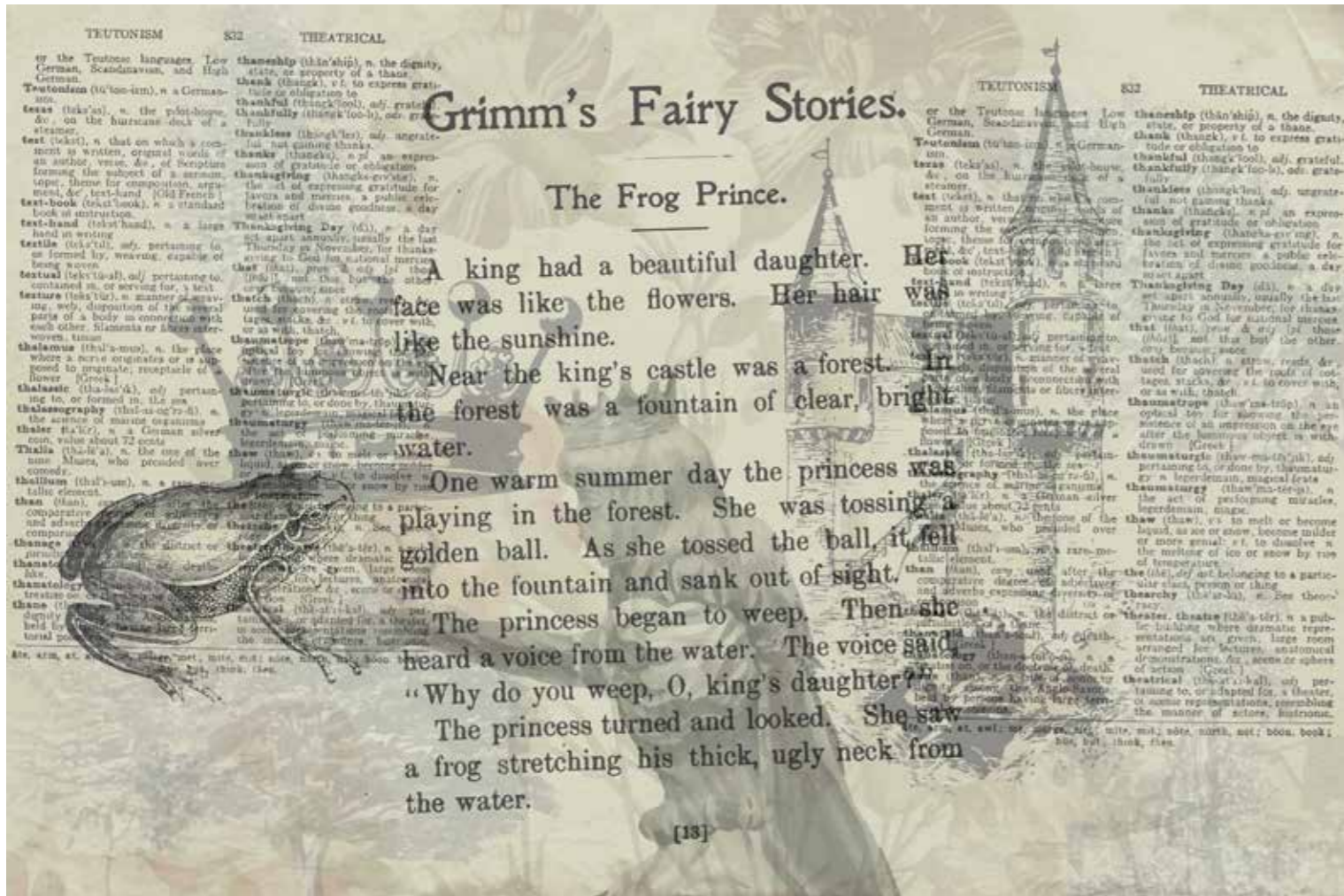

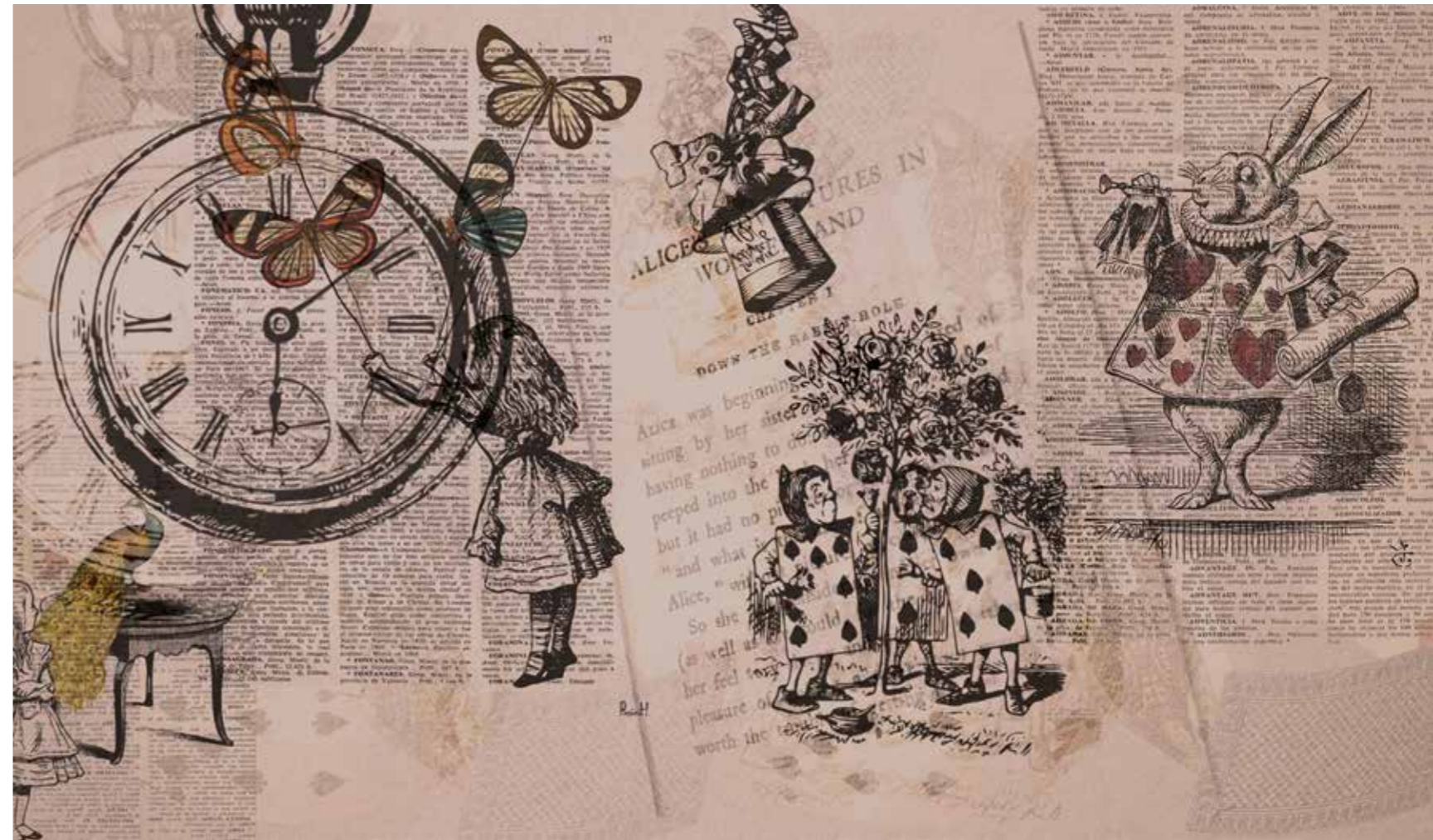

thallium (thal'i-um), *n* a rare metallic element.

than (than), *conj* used after the comparative degree of adjectives and adverbs expressing diversity or comparison.

thane (thā'n), *n* the district or jurisdiction of a thane.

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thane (thān), *n* a title of honor or dignity among the Anglo-Saxons, held by persons having large territorial possessions.

thaneship (thān'ship), *n* the dignity, state, or property of a thane.

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thatch (thach), *n* straw, reeds, &c, used for covering the roofs of cottages, stacks, &c. *v t* to cover with, or as with, thatch.

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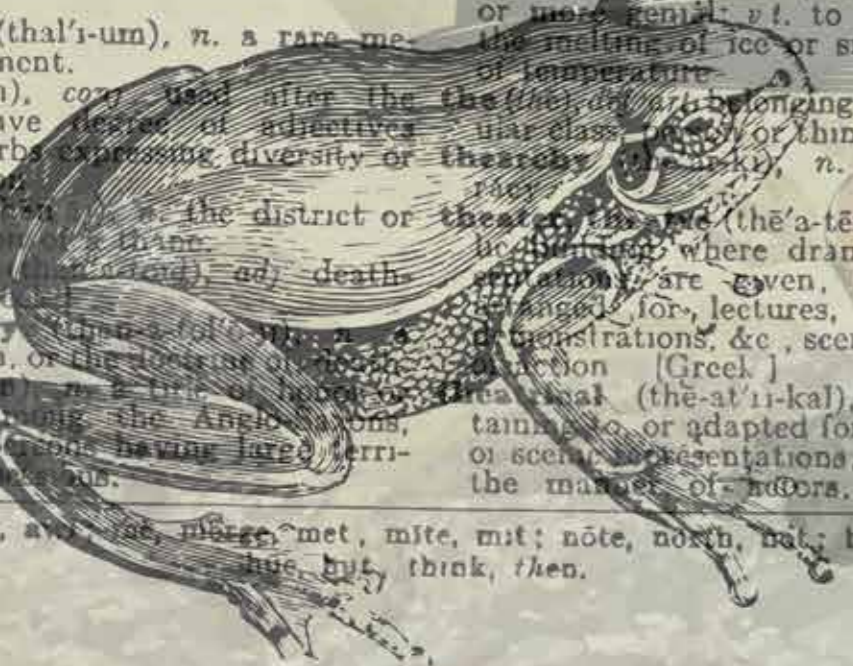
